Reading

As you are aware, every child should have either a Reading Record (Year R through to Year 6). You may notice that your child can read the book they bring home quite well, or it is a book they have read before. This is completely deliberate! Each book should be read at least three times. Once for fluency, once for comprehension (understanding) and once for prosody (expression). To make it more exciting we are going to be offering the 'Theddlethorpe Reading Raffle'

Every time your child has read at home, please mark in their reading record. When they reach 20 times they will receive a raffle ticket to pop their name on and put into a box. At the end of each half term a raffle ticket will be picked out to receive a small prize. More reads = more tickets, more tickets = more chances to win!
