Medication Collection



Please be reminded that all medication kept in school, inhalers etc., must be collected on the last day of term as we are unable to store them over the summer break. Medicines will not be kept for the new school year. In September, it is essential that all prescribed medication that is needed to be kept in school for your child is brought to the school office.

Breakfast club

Further to our recent survey, we have taken the decision to introduce a breakfast club after the Summer holidays. It is our intention to start the club on Monday 5 September 2022. At a cost of £2.00 per session. Children can be dropped off from 8.00am for 45 mins; bookings are essential through PAY 360 as we have limited capacity. Staff will then take the children to their teachers at 8:45am to join the others coming into school.

Attendance

We aim for 100% attendance every day. It is said that good attendance = best achievement: it's not just about learning in lessons, but all the interaction with other children and teachers which can give confidence and self-understanding as they grow. We are sure we can count on the support of all our parents and carers to ensure children are in school, on time, every day.

Timings of the School Day

It is imperative that you are at school in enough time before the gates are closed at 8:55 in the morning. Unfortunately, late arrivals cause disruption in the school office, as well as in the classroom routines and lessons that have already begun by 9 a.m. The school day for all of the children will finish at 3.30 p.m.
